Paul --Delhi: Cambridge University Press, 2016</p> <p>This volume explores the possibilities of peaceful accommodation of rising powers in the changed international context, especially against the backdrop of intensified globalization. War as a system changing mechanism is unimaginable, given that it would escalate into nuclear conflict and the destruction of the planet. It is therefore essential that policymakers in established as well as rising states devise strategies to allow transitions without resorting to war. The first volume identifies gender inequalities in the impact of agricultural modernisation and technical change across Asia and Africa; the links between women, poverty, and economic growth processes; and data biases in measuring women's work. It traces the gendered costs of droughts and famine, and challenges top-down methods of innovation diffusion. The second volume demonstrates how promoting access to property, especially land, is key to enhancing women's economic and social well-being and deterring domestic violence.  Changing status of Jewish women in Israel: 1948-2000/ Seema Ahuja--Mumbai: Himalaya Publishing, 2016  
 Discusses economic, political, social status of Jewish women in Israel since the establishment of the Israeli state in 1948.
- 6 Anuradha, K. 49166  
 Tribals participation in Naxalite movement: perception, motivation and survival/ K. Anuradha and Jagannath Dash--New Delhi: Concept Publishing, 2016  
 This book is an outcome of an empirical study which aimed to study the factors of tribal participation in the Naxal movement, their causes, their backgrounds, perceptions, motivations and possible solutions for the future. The content is the outcome of the personal interviews with the jailed, underground Naxals, their sympathizers, government functionaries working in south Orissa, civil society organizations, and community based organizations.
- 7 Asia in international relations: unlearning imperial power relations/ edited by Pinar Bilgin and L.H.M. Ling--London: Routledge, 2017 49205  
 Covering the Indian subcontinent, Turkey, the Mediterranean, Iran, the Arab world, Ethiopia, and Central-Northeast-Southeast Asia, the volume draws on rich literature to develop our understanding of power relations in the world's largest continent. Contributors "de-colonize", "de-imperialize", and "de-Cold War" the region to articulate an alternative narrative about Asia, world politics, and IR. This approach reframes old problems in new ways with the possibility of transforming them, rather than recycling the same old approaches with the same old "intractable" outcomes.
- 8 Atwal, Jyoti 49110  
 Real and imagined widows: gender relations in colonial North India/ Jyoti Atwal--Delhi: Primus Books, 2016  
 This book explores the politico-cultural imagination that formed the subtext of the reformist, nationalist and women's discourses on widowhood from the colonial period to the 1950s. It examines legislative debates on the relationship between sexuality, morality, property rights and widowhood, and explores the world of literate widows of the early twentieth century. It also traces the manner in which the complex connection between the nineteenth-century idea of widowhood and the concept of the anti-colonial Mother India of the 1920s transformed the notion of the ideal Hindu widow into a metaphor for a struggling/recovering nation in post-colonial India.

- 9 बडेरिया, तारक नाथ 49076  
 बिहार की लोक कलाएं एवं शिल्प/ तारक नाथ बडेरिया--नई दिल्ली, नेशनल पब्लिशिंग हाउस, २०१६  
 विवेच्य पुस्तक में बिहार को छः क्षेत्रों में विभक्त कर, प्रत्येक क्षेत्र में प्रचलित लोक कलाओं एवं शिल्प का सचित्र विवरण दिया है। धार्मिक, सामाजिक और सांस्कृतिक परम्पराओं से जुड़ी, इन लोक कलाओं को मुख्यतः तीज त्यौहारों और उत्सवों में विशेष मान्यता प्राप्त है। बिहार में प्रत्येक त्यौहार पर लोक कला को लोक कल्याण की भावना से चित्रित करते हैं। इसमें लोक की सामूहिक अभिव्यक्ति होती है। आलोच्य पुस्तक में बिहार की लोक शिल्प कलाओं तथा शिल्प उद्योग पर भी प्रकाश डाला गया है।
- 10 Bhattacharjee, Govind 49112  
 Special category states of India/ Govind Bhattacharjee--New Delhi: Oxford University Press, 2016  
 Eleven economically backward hill states of India, sharing international boundaries, have been awarded the 'Special Category Status' by the Centre, an extra-constitutional arrangement that gives them access to liberal central plan assistance. Under the existing provisions, which have a weak accountability structure, these states will permanently remain 'special category states', irrespective of their fiscal, financial, and socio-economic performance. Now that fresh demands are being raised by some states for this status, the author, explores the reality of these Special Category States in the context of asymmetric federalism, going down to the roots of their backwardness. By analyzing meticulously collected data, he evaluates their socio-economic progress as well as public financial management ever since the status was first awarded in 1969.
- 11 Bhatta, Zarina 49152  
 Purdah to piccadilly: a Muslim woman's struggle for identity/ Zarina Bhatta--New Delhi: Sage Publications, 2016  
 Tracing the life of Zarina Bhatta, a Muslim woman born and brought up in pre-partition India, this memoir narrates the experiences of a woman who strove to break out of the stereotypical roles imposed by the society of her times. It chronicles her life over 80 years, portraying the political and social conditions of undivided and post-Independence India. Zarina's story is a story of grit, perseverance and determination to battle against all odds.

- 12 Bhinekawati, Risa 49212  
Corporate social responsibility and sustainable development: social capital and corporate development in developing economies/ Risa Bhinekawati--London: Routledge, 2017  
This book supports Sen's assertions that poverty can be alleviated if the capability of individuals is improved. It shows that sustainable development goals can be achieved when the company's CSR programs and social capital development in improving people's capabilities are combined with necessary finance access and market access for the poor. The theoretical model developed from the journey of Astra International, one of the largest public-listed companies in Indonesia, is replicable for other companies aspiring to be sustainable in developing countries. The model shows a virtuous cycle between the corporate aim, CSR programs, social capital and corporate sustainability.
- 13 Bourdieusian Prospects/ edited by Lisa Adkins, Caragh Brosnan and Steven Threadgold--London : Routledge, 2017 49206  
Bourdieu's Prospects considers the ongoing relevance of Bourdieu's social theory for contemporary social science. Breaking with the tendency to reflect on Bourdieu's legacies, it brings established and emergent scholars together to debate the futures of a specifically Bourdieusian sociology. The chapters which comprise this book have been selected based on an international symposium, held at the University of Newcastle, Australia, in 2013. Contributors to this volume set out to map the potentials of Bourdieusian inflected social science.
- 14 Brecher, Michael 49189  
Political leadership and charisma: Nehru, Ben-Gurion and other 20th century political leaders: intellectual Odyssey I/ Michael Brecher--Cham: Palgrave Macmillan, 2016  
This publication compares the charismatic role of two political leaders, Jawaharlal Nehru and David Ben-Gurion, along with assessments of many other 20th century political leaders' aiming to study an important dimension of global politics: charismatic leadership. Both India and Israel have experienced the crucial role of charismatic leaders, Nehru and Ben Gurion, who dominated their states and societies for a near-identical formative period in their political independence, 1947-64 and 1948-63 respectively, as charismatic leaders. Their impact, the author shows, extended far beyond their states to both their geographic regions and global politics.

- 15 Briggs, Jacqueline 49193  
 Young people and political participation: teen players/ Jacqueline Briggs--London: Palgrave Macmillan, 2017  
 It analyses the various ways and the extent to which young people participate in politics, focusing primarily on the UK and including cross-national comparisons where relevant. It covers topics including: what is meant by political participation; youth political participation on a pan-European basis; new social media and youth political participation; whether the voting age should be lowered to 16; youth participation at the local level; and young women and political participation.
- 16 Chakrabarti, Saumya 49058  
 Inclusive growth and social change: formal-informal-agrarian relations in India/ Saumya Chakrabarti--New Delhi: Oxford University Press, 2016  
 This book posits that, despite the consistently high growth rate driven by the formal sector, informality exists without substantial improvement in its basic economic conditions. It explores the conflicts and complementarities between both segments of the economy arguing that these interactions lead to a distorted structure of capitalism. With in-depth theoretical foundations and empirical analysis, the book interrogates the paradigm of 'growth' being 'inclusive', proposing that only a comprehensive structural change can resolve the challenges of the informal sector.
- 17 Chakrabarty, Bidyut 49135  
 Ethics in governance in India/ Bidyut Chakrabarty--London: Routledge, 2016  
 Governance and ethics are intertwined. This book situates ethics in governance in India in the national frame and incorporates the context of globalization, allowing for the increasing importance of non-state global actors in national decision making. The author argues that a lack of ethics quickly turns into corruption and leads to governmental efforts to deal with it. He proposes that ethics are a set of standards that a society places on itself to articulate its responses to societal needs, and discusses the efforts of the Indian government at eradicating corruption and its failure to do so.
- 18 Chakrabarty, Bidyut 49168  
 Winning the mandate: the Indian experience/ Bidyut Chakrabarty and Sugato Hazra--New Delhi: Sage Publications, 2016  
 This book captures how electioneering has changed over the years and how media and marketing have assumed more significance than party manifestos. The author observes that on 16th May 2014, India witnessed the result of an intense political campaign. India's national election for the 16th Lok Sabha in 2014 will remain a landmark in the annals of political campaigns. The work is thus a study of campaign strategies, how they are framed, and the role of local actors and to what extent individuals rule over ideologies and vice versa.

- 19 Chakraborty, Pinaki 49157  
Social sector in a decentralized economy: India in the era of globalization/ Pinaki Chakraborty, Lekha Chakraborty and Anit Mukherjee--Delhi: Cambridge University Press, 2016  
It is an analytical examination of financing and public service delivery challenges in a decentralized framework. By unpacking the process of decentralization, the authors identify that 'unfunded mandates' arising from the asymmetry between finances and functions at local levels is a major challenge. Using the household survey statistics of consumption expenditure, an analysis of utilization or benefit incidence of public spending on social sectors in India is done, covering education and health sectors.
- 20 Chalari, Athanasia 49228  
Sociology of the individual: relating self and society/ Athanasia Chalari--Los Angeles: Sage Publications, 2017  
This book aims at offering thorough, critical and simplified overviews of key sociological and psychological concepts related to the sociological exploration of the individual; to be able to explain the limitations related to each conceptualization regarding its ability to provide a concrete definition of what the individual is; to offer the ways individual is connected to society; to combine, in a critical and synthesized manner, sociological and psychological views towards the construction of a meaningful, comprehensible and applicable sociological theorization of intra-action; finally, to make clear that the relationship between the individual and society or between structure and agency can be approached through the combined as well as distinct examination of the concepts of interaction and intra-action.
- 21 Changing contours of microfinance in India/ edited by Jayadev M. and Diatha Krishna Sundar--London: Routledge, 2016 49122  
This publication brings together empirical evidences and theoretical perspectives to provide a comprehensive overview of the microfinance sector in India. The essays in the volume focus on the application of information and communication technology (ICT) solutions in microfinance institutions to strengthen the savings movement and widen credit access to the poor and marginalized sections of society; present case studies on self-help group (SHG) movements, federations and SHG-Bank Linkage programmes; propose measures for strengthening regulatory and governance structures of the microfinance sector; and identify linkages between overall financial inclusion and the contribution of microfinance institutions (MFIs).

- 22 Changing village in India: insights from longitudinal research/ edited by Himanshu, Praveen Jha and Gerry Rodgers--New Delhi: Oxford University Press, 2016 49093  
 The book analyses aspects of change in rural India, through recent research, based on longitudinal village studies. It addresses three broad areas of concern- the first relates to the method and conceptual framework of longitudinal village studies, how information is collected and the ways in which it is used and analysed; the second aims at a broad understanding of villages across different dimensions of economy and society, offering wide and integrated accounts of particular villages; and the third explores particular themes in some detail, including production structures, land, labour, gender and migration within this broader framework.
- 23 Children and violence: politics of conflict in South Asia/ edited by Bina D'Costa--Delhi: Cambridge University Press, 2016 49077  
 Children's diverse experiences during periods of conflict, post-conflict and peacetime reveal that their roles in society and political communities are complex. Based on this premise, this book suggests that understanding children's roles involves a critical analysis of where the child is situated within her/his family, within socio-political networks and within the state. By examining various case studies in South Asia, a region that is marked as much by its homogeneity as by its immense diversity, the book observes that significant tensions exist between universal and local approaches to childhood. It reflects how the development of international and national discourses on children's rights and protection is relevant to children's everyday lives in situations of conflicts.
- 24 China and India: history, culture, cooperation and competition/ edited by Paramita Mukherjee, Arnab K. Deb and Miao Peng--New Delhi: Sage Publications, 2016 49123  
 This book explores the differences in the functioning of Indian and Chinese economies and identifies the prime factors responsible for this. In order to have an in-depth understanding of the causes, the contribution of sociocultural factors and the role of political and strategic relationships are also closely examined. Comprehensive in approach, it encompasses history, culture, political relations and current business strategies of both the nations.
- 25 Citizenship agendas in and beyond the nation-state/ edited by Martijn Koster, Rivke Jaffe and Anouk de Koning--London: Routledge, 2017 49208  
 This book analyses the formulation, implementation, and contestation of normative framings of citizenship, termed as 'citizenship agendas'. Some of these agendas are part and parcel of the working of the nation-state. Other citizenship agendas, however, are produced beyond the nation-state. The chapters in this book study various sites where the meaning of the good citizen is framed and negotiated in different ways by state and non-state actors.

- 26 Comparative perspectives on the substance of EU democracy promotion/ edited by Anne Wetzel, Jan Orbie and Fabienne Bossuyt--London: Routledge, 2017 49209  
 This volume examines the substance of European Union (EU) democracy promotion by comparing it with the norms of governance that the other international actors promote, among them are the United Nations, the United States, the Central and East European EU member states, Russia, China and non-governmental organizations. The book offers a better understanding of the EU's democracy promotion agenda and the (in) distinctiveness of the norms diffused by the EU. Building on a common conceptual introduction, the chapters follow different theoretical approaches and research designs, and focus on a range of diverse case studies.
- 27 Complex political decision-making: leadership, legitimacy and communication/ edited by Peter Bursens and others--London: Routledge, 2017 49210  
 Complex Political Decision-Making addresses the impact of an increasingly complex environment on the legitimacy and transparency of politics, on the role of leadership and political personality and on motivated images, rhetoric and communication. Examining how these issues interact at the macro and theoretical levels, the types of problems decision-makers face and how they communicate ideas with their audiences, it brings together leading experts in political psychology, law and political science to bridge the gap in the way these disciplines explore the issue of complex decision-making.
- 28 Congress and policy making in the 21st century/ edited by Jeffery A. Jenkins and Eric M. Patashnik--New York: Cambridge University Press, 2016 49126  
 This book discusses the performance of Congress in the domestic arena, focusing on issues such as immigration, health care, and the repeal of "Don't Ask, Don't Tell." It examines how Congress tackles - and fails to tackle - key policy challenges in an era of growing social diversity and ideological polarization.
- 29 Constitutional School of American Public Administration /edited by Stephanie P. Newbold and David H. Rosenbloom--New York: Routledge, 2017 49211  
 This edited volume explores how the rule of law and democratic-constitutionalism serve as the intellectual, theoretical and practical foundations of the American administrative state. Discusses the Constitutional School and its relevance to democratic governance with particular reference to U. S. public administration. Also focuses on issues and controversies that are currently shaping the Constitutional School and the application of the Constitutional School to public administration theory and practice.

- 30 Contemporary approaches to public policy: theories, controversies and perspectives/ edited by B. Guy Peters and Philippe Zittoun --London: Palgrave Macmillan, 2016 49177
- This book considers a range of contemporary approaches to public policy studies. These approaches are based on a number of theoretical perspectives on decision-making, as well as alternative perspectives on policy instruments and implementation. The range of approaches covered in the volume includes punctuated equilibrium models, the advocacy-coalition framework, multiple streams approaches, institutional analyses, constructivist approaches, behavioural models, and the use of instruments as an approach to public policy. The volume concludes with a discussion of fundamental issues of democracy in public policy.
- 31 Corporate governance in India: change and continuity/ edited by Asish K. Bhattacharyya--New Delhi: Oxford University Press, 2016 49055
- This work provides an insight into advancing and improving corporate governance practices in India. It explores the evolution of corporate governance and discusses crucial aspects such as compensation for executives, gender diversity on Indian boards, ethical business, independent directors, audit committees, corporate governance in state-owned enterprises, and corporate social responsibility. The volume also critically examines important provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 along with the revised clause 49.
- 32 Cuervo-Cazurra, Alvaro 49079
- Emerging market multinationals: managing operational challenges for sustained international growth/ Alvaro Cuervo-Cazurra, William Newburry and Seung Ho Park--Cambridge: Cambridge University Press, 2016
- Examines the specific challenges faced by emerging market multinationals as they seek to develop their international operations and proposes actionable solutions for them. The authors combine academic analyses with real-world cases to provide a clear framework for understanding some of the barriers that prevent firms from emerging economies from succeeding abroad and show what actions can be taken to achieve sustained international growth.
- 33 Dalit literatures in India/ edited by Joshil K. Abraham and Judith Misrahi-Barak--New Delhi: Routledge, 2016 49127
- This volume canvases a host of literary genres including Dalit poetry, novels, autobiographies, pamphlets, short stories and testimonies, Dalit art and graphic novels. Bringing together incisive essays by renowned and emerging scholars in the field, it compares Dalit writings with other forms of subaltern writings across the world, and explores the literatures of Dalit Muslims and Dalit Christians.

- 34 Dalit studies/ edited by Ramnarayan S. Rawat and K. Satyanarayana--  
Ranikhet: Permanent Black, 2016 49233
- The contributors to this volume trace the strategies through which Dalits have been marginalized as well as the ways Dalit intellectuals and leaders have shaped emancipatory politics in modern India. Several essays discuss the ways Dalits used the colonial courts and legislature to gain minority rights in the early twentieth century, while others highlight Dalit activism in social and religious spheres. The contributors also examine the struggle of contemporary middle-class Dalits to reconcile their caste and class, intercaste tensions among Sikhs, and the efforts by Dalit writers to challenge dominant constructions of secular and class-based citizenship while emphasizing the ongoing destructiveness of caste identity.
- 35 Das Gupta, Chirashree 49161
- State and capital in independent India: institutions and accumulation/  
Chirashree Das Gupta--Delhi: Cambridge University Press, 2016
- Presents a historical account of the relationship between state and capital from independence till the liberalisation episodes of the 1980s and after. It analysis the interstices of the organisation of the business houses, corporate governance structures, labour laws, and the institution of the family and personal laws, and explains the institutional basis of regional differences in accumulation and uneven development in independent India. It provides an insightful study of the political economy of the role of changing social relations in India after independence.
- 36 Dash, Sandipani 49072
- Regional resurgence in Africa: prospects and challenges of African  
Union/ Sandipani Dash--New Delhi: Indian Council of World  
Affairs and Vj Book India Pvt Ltd., 2017
- Regional Resurgence in Africa: Prospects and Challenges of African Union perceives the AU as a pan African entity with its mandate for 'comprehensive security' in the continent, implying its pursuit of three security objectives: resolution of armed conflicts, political stability and economic security. The AU's interrelationship with the state system, existing and emerging social faultiness, and the multiple regional processes in Africa are interrogated by undertaking case studies on territorial, political and economic security concerns. The findings of this analysis are used to explore the scope for policy improvisation pertaining to the interface among the AU, its member countries and the emerging extra-regional powers, including India.

- 37 Demanding justice in the global South: claiming rights / edited by Jean Grugel and others--Cham: Palgrave Macmillan, 2017 49178
- This volume is about the politics of claiming rights and the strategies of mobilization by marginalized social groups. It brings together debates on contentious politics of resistance to open up new questions about how and why some social groups are able to mobilize and achieve impacts despite structural constraints in which they operate. The collection emphasises both the difficulties of political mobilisation and the distinctive methods employed by various social groups across a variety of contexts to respond and overcome these challenges.
- 38 Democratic dynasties: state, party and family in contemporary Indian politics/ edited by Kanchan Chandra--Delhi: Cambridge University Press, 2016 49128
- It introduces a theoretical perspective on dynasticism in democracies, using original data on twenty-first-century Indian parliament. It argues that the roots of dynastic politics lie at least in part in modern democratic institutions - the state and political parties - which give political families a leg up in the electoral process. It also proposes a rethinking of the view that dynastic politics is a violation of democracy, showing that it can reinforce some aspects of democracy while violating others. Finally, this book suggests that both reinforcement and violation are the products, not of some property intrinsic to political dynasties, but of the institutional environment from which those dynasties emerge.
- 39 Democratic transformations in Europe: challenges and opportunities/ edited by Yvette Peters and Michael Tatham --London: Routledge, 2016 49213
- This book is about the challenges democratic states are facing. These are articulated around the three central themes of (1) citizen-state relations, (2) the restructuring of the politics and institutions of the state, and (3) governance beyond and below the state. The book combines these into an overview of the state of contemporary democracy, its challenges, opportunities and its dynamic capability to adapt. It deals with the perpetual threats to and transformations of democracy and the state's ability to protect and strengthen its democratic component. Discusses 'Europe 31', which includes the European Union's 28 member states plus Switzerland, Norway, and Iceland.

- 40 Democratisation in the Himalayas: interests, conflicts and negotiations/  
edited by Vibha Arora and N. Jayaram--London: Routledge, 2017 49214
- Democratisation is a formidable task in the Himalayan region owing to its immense cultural heterogeneity. This volume discusses competing interests; identity politics that permeates political formations, the transformations in the traditional forms of governance and their adaption to democratic institutions; the genesis and periodic eruptions of ethnic assertions, and attempts to resolve ethnic conflict. It shows how recent efforts at deepening democratic values and implementing social justice have been resisted and contested. The book argues that the play of ethnicity, the creation of political parties and interest groups, the emergence of social movements, and the voice of protest and opposition do not indicate a crisis in democracy but comprise the instruments by which the state is pushed towards reform, welfare, and inclusive politics, and is obliged to listen to the people.
- 41 Derne, Steve 49158
- Sociology of well-being: lessons from India/ Steve Derne--New Delhi: Sage Publications, 2017
